MESSAGE FROM THE METROPOLITAN

Dearly Beloved,

It was indeed a pleasure for me to visit our Mexico Mission field at Matamoros on July 26, 2015. I am very impressed with the progress we have made there. It is gratifying to note that we were able to assist three girls there to earn their medical, engineering and nursing degrees, respectively. I am hoping that we will also be able to support and educate some of the boys there. The work the North American Diocese is doing in Mexico is very novel and different from our approach in other mission fields. Our goal should be to make the Mexico mission a self-sustaining operation so that the people there will be able to assist more of their own. To achieve that goal, we have to identify clergy who are willing to learn Spanish and serve the people there. I have authorized our clergy, with the permission of the Diocesan Episcopa, to conduct our sacraments for the people in Colonia Mar Thoma if they request our services. We can also offer the people temporary church membership so that they can function as a prayer group that strengthens its faith through prayer and study of the word of God.



Our church has become global. From a community that worships in Malayalam within Kerala, we have grown to become a community that worships in Kannada in Karnataka, Tamil in Tamil Nadu, Hindi in various parts of North India, German and Irish in Europe, French in some parts of Canada, English in all parts of the world, and now Spanish in Mexico. We thank God for enabling our church to grow in this manner, and pray that He will continue to lead us on in this journey to fulfill His mission and establish the Kingdom of God. We want you to join in His mission with enthusiasm.

2015 DIOCESAN ASSEMBLY

The Diocesan Assembly was held on July 2, 2015, at the St. Thomas MTC, Yonkers, NY. The Metropolitan, Most Rev. Dr. Joseph Mar Thoma, presided. Rev. Binoy Thomas, Diocesan Secretary, welcomed the Assembly. Rev. Dr. Sham P. Thomas led the devotion. The Diocesan Episcopa Rt. Rev. Dr. Geevarghese Mar Theodosius addressed the Assembly and highlighted the impact that migration has had on our Diocese in two areas; (1) Faith vs. Secularism, and (2) Consumerism vs. Sharing. The Metropolitan addressed the assembly, conveyed his greetings on behalf of the Church, and inaugurated the Clergy Scholarship Fund. The Annual Report and Accounts of 2014, Budget for 2015, and various resolutions were passed unanimously by the assembly.



DIOCESAN CLERGY FAMILY CONFERENCE



The 2015 Diocesan Clergy Family Conference was held at the St. Thomas MTC, Yonkers, NY. Rt. Rev. Dr. Geevarghese Mar Theodosius Episcopa delivered the Presidential Address, addressed the theme, and elaborated on the contemporary challenges faced by the Church. The Most Rev. Dr. Joseph Mar Thoma Metropolitan delivered the inaugural message and inaugurated the conference. Rev. Dr. Sham P. Thomas led the main talks on the topic, "Refocusing Pastoral Ministry in the Context of Contemporary Challenges." Achen highlighted the importance of the church being the "hope for humanity," and emphasized that without hope, the church will suffer. Baskiomos' sessions on "Relevant Contextual Ministry: Role of Clergy

Family," were led by Rev. Abraham Scaria P. and Mrs. Bindu Abraham. Rev. Denny Philip led a session on "Culture and Ministry." Mrs. Jiby Binoy and Mrs. Jubi Shibu led a practical session on "Table setting, Bed-making, and use of Technology." The children's sessions were led by the youth of the St. Thomas MTC. There was a birthday cake cutting and celebration on behalf of the Clergy for His Grace the Metropolitan. Theodosius Thirumeni thanked the Vicar and the St. Thomas MTC, New York, for all their work and effort. The meeting ended with a prayer and benediction by the Metropolitan.

2015 DIOCESAN FAMILY CONFERENCE

The 31st Diocesan Family Conference, hosted by the Northeast Regional Activities Committee (RAC), was held from July 2 to 5, 2015, at the Hilton Stamford Hotel, Stamford, CT. The theme of the conference was 'Harvest 2015: Harvest in the family of families and hope for humanity'. The Metropolitan, Most Rev. Dr. Joseph Mar Thoma presided over the opening session and inaugurated the conference. In his inaugural address the Metropolitan stated that the mission of the church is fulfilled only through the families and that we should strive for a new humanity. The Diocesan Episcopa presided over the Family Conference. The Metropolitan Thirumeni and Diocesan Episcopa led various sessions. Rev. Dr. Sham P. Thomas led the main talks based on the theme. His talks emphasized the challenges and possibilities of the Diaspora community. Rev.

Binu C. Samuel, Rev. Mathew Baby, Rev. George Cherian and Rev. Dennis Abraham led the Bible studies for the various groups. Dr. Jesudas Athyal, Rev. Abraham Scaria P. and Dr. Shaun Rajan presented talks at various sessions. Special talks were also given by Most Rev. Dr. Thomas Mar Eusebius, and Mr. Mathew George. In conjunction with the family conference a souvenir and the latest issue of Yuvadhara were published. The conference was instrumental in providing a renewed vision and commitment for the mission and ministry of the church. Approximately 550 participants from 250 families from all over the Diocese attended.
