

# Message from the Diocesan Episcopa

#### Dearly beloved in Christ,

"I am the only one left..." I Kings 19: 14 (b)

We live in a world where many people are stressed and tensed. Though human beings are created to be born into a family, live in a community, and grow towards the culmination of the Kingdom experience, many in the modern era prefer to be independent, live alone, and die unattended. Where there is no vision, people perish. Where there is no hope, people commit suicide. Is this the purpose of life?

The prophet Elijah pours his heart to God in a desperate and depressed state when he confronted King Ahab and Queen Jezebel. He says that his life is threatened, Israel became disobedient to God, and he is left alone (v. 14). So the prophet's desire is to put an end to his life and withdraw from the land (v. 4). God intervenes and corrects him by saying that the prophet is wrong and that God has greater plans for his life (vv. 15-18).

Are we stressed? Does our future look bleak? St. Paul writing to the people in Corinth says, "but in Him it has always been YES" (II Cor. 1: 19). What can one man do? This is a question often asked by people. The Bible says that one person can make a difference as seen in the lives of Noah, Daniel, Ruth, Esther, Jeremiah, and the Virgin Mary. Malala Yousafzai, a fifteen year old girl who was shot in the head at point blank range by the Taliban in Pakistan, journeyed up to United Nations in New York speaking for the rights of young girls to seek education. She stands as a model who believes in the power of one person's voice to inspire change in the world. What about us, who are members of a church journeying with Christ? Let our lives reveal to the world the incredible power of faith in action.

At this time, I also seek your fervent prayers and support for the victims of Typhoon Haiyan that has devastated the lives of hundreds of thousands in the Philippines. It is going to take a lot of effort to rebuild the lives of those who survived this storm.
