Message from the Diocesan Episcopa

Dearly beloved in Christ,

'For three years now, I have been coming to look for fruit on this fig tree and haven't found any.....' (Luke 13:7).

Happy New Year! An eventful 2013 has gone by. We have stepped into the New Year. Rather, God has granted us another year to exist in His Vineyard. It is not by our merit, but by His grace.

The man in this parable selected his vineyard to plant a fig tree - Luke 13:6-9. He took care of the vineyard and fertilized it every year. Usually, a fig tree is planted on the way side, but this man decided to give this tree a unique and special place. He liked the tree very much and therefore he came frequently to see it and expected it to bear fruit at the right time. Though three years was more than sufficient for the tree to bear fruit, the man was disappointed in not seeing the expected result. So he ponders about cutting it down and saving the soil. The caretaker convinced the man to give it one more year, to dig around the tree, to manure it, and to allow the tree to grow and bear fruit. Thereby, we see that though the judgment for the tree is certain, grace is shown in extending its time.

Our Creator God is granting us another year to yield the expected fruits. Having completed the celebration of the silver Jubilee year, our diocese has entered into a new year of activity. God's expectation of the Diocese is His expectation from every parish, family, and member, as we are intrinsically interwoven to form the body of Christ. God has given our members a unique place in the Land. Think of the love and care God is giving to each one of us. We are accountable for all the blessings and privileges God has given. We are called to be mindful of God's expectation about us, and be good stewards in handling the time, talents, and our life.

The diocesan National Leadership Conference was held at the Mar Thoma Church, San Francisco. I am pleased that 130 delegates from 35 parishes attended the 4-day training program from January 2 to 5, 2014. The delegates were above age 21, and represent the new generation and cream of our community who are capable of deciding and acting on various church-related matters. The present and the future of the diocese rest on them. They are expected to yield fruit through their collective life, leadership, and action. As they look beyond the Diaspora they should envision what the life, work, and fruits of the church should be.
