

Message from the Diocesan Bishop

Dear friends in Christ,

'It is for freedom that Christ has set us free. Stand firm, then, and do not let yourself be burdened again by a yoke of slavery' Galatians 5:1.

Canada Day was celebrated on July 1. American independence was commemorated on July 4. These holidays are for people in their respective countries to gather and enjoy various festivities honoring their independence. In a similar manner, the Holy Bible reminds the children of God of the freedom God has given to each one of us.

Galatians 5:1 tells us about the freedom Christ has given us through His death and resurrection: freedom from Sin, wrath of God, the Law, and the 'desires of the flesh'. How do we experience that freedom in our daily life? We should experience that freedom through: (1) daily assurance that Christ is our Savior who is willing to forgive our sins. It is not a license to sin, but an expression of God's grace; (2) understanding that difficulties, sickness, and pain are not because of the wrath of God, because Jesus tells us that God is love and calls us to abide in that love; (3) reading the Holy Scripture and recognizing that it is given to us not to enslave us with the do's and don'ts in it, but to show us the divine light in our path for a righteous living; and (4) accepting that humans live in the world not by becoming a slave to the desires of the flesh and the desires of the world. We are reminded that we belong to God and are called to be holy.

Living free enables us to take up responsibilities for all that God has given us and for becoming a source of blessing for others. We can do so only if we are willing to care and serve others with a spirit of vicarious sacrifice. It reminds us of the love of God and the need to love others. Jesus gave us a new commandment: 'Love as I have loved you'. St. Paul writes in 1 Corinthians 13 that, the greatest of all is love (v.13). God loves you. When God's love grows in us through Christ, we feel free by the guidance of the Holy Spirit to let that love flow on to others.
