MESSAGE FROM THE BISHOP

Dear Friends in Christ,

The first issue of *Besorah*, the news letter of the Diocese, has caught the attention of a large number of people. As the *Besorah* is well accepted, we intend to publish it every month.

In 2011, our Diocese held ten National conferences at various places. I appreciate all the organizers and pray that all the conference attendees continue to be blessed for a fruitful Christian Living. The most significant among these conferences in the Diocese is the National Family Conference which brings together the Families from all walks of life.

In 2012, the 30th National Family Conference will take place at the National Conference Centre, in Leesburg, Virginia (near Washington DC) from July 5 to July 8. The themes selected is, "Remembering the Covenant for a Reforming Church" (Joshua 24: 24). The Holy Bible tells us that God remembers His covenant with His people. The people of God are expected to remember the Covenant they have with God. Starting from Adam we have the Biblical narration about the fall of man which compels God to re-establish the Covenant with His people. Featuring the Mexico Mission...

The Diocesan Episcopa, Rt. Rev. Dr. Geevarghese Mar Theodosius visited Mexico Mission field on October 21st, 2011. Thirumeni was accompanied by Diocesan Secretary Rev. K.E Geevarghese, Treasurer Chacko Mathew, Council member Arlene Mathew and Mexico Mission Sub Committee members Rev. Zachariah John, Rev. A. T. Thomas, John Thomas and P. T. Abraham.

Mexico Mission Infrastructure development and the Education / Nutrition assistance programs are progressing well. Currently there are 35 families living in Colonia Mar Thoma. More families are moving into the allotted houses. Drinking water distribution system and fencing to secure the Colonia and Hostel properties were recently completed. Work is in progress for building the septic system, flood control plans, kitchen and bathrooms. Efforts are also under way for establishing electrical connections.

The "Manna" (Diocese's Nutrition assistance program) is progressing well since its inception in June 2011. We are distributing essential grocery kits to each family on weekly basis. This has substantially reduced the starvation and poverty of Colonia residents. During his visit, Thirumeni initiated a green program, "A Tree for a House," where each family will be provided a fruit tree, which is to be planted and nurtured by the family. Members of the Diocese can get involved and sponsor a tree for a house for \$30. We expect to implement this program in January 2012. Your involvement and prayers are greatly needed and appreciated.

Leadership conference in Alabama

The second leadership conference was held during the weekend of October 29th-30th. 23 persons participated. Of these, 14 persons were from the Choctaw community and the rest were our members from Atlanta and Alabama. The conference, especially the mentoring portion was a blessing. Our goal is to develop ten young people from the Choctaw community to provide active leadership in the 2012 VBS.


ECUMENICAL RELATIONS
